Bustard Tree Farm Supplies National Christmas Tree



In its 86-year history, 2015 was by far the most exciting year for Bustard's Christmas Trees, a family business with roots in an orchard. Last summer the National Christmas Tree Growers Association (NCTGA) selected it to supply the official White House Christmas tree, which stood tall and proud in the Blue Room.

To qualify for the national competition, growers must win in their states. Jay and Glenn Bustard entered a Meyer spruce in the Pennsylvania Christmas Tree Growers Association (PCTGA) contest. They came home with a victory and began preparation for a journey to Spring Grove, Illinois, in July. The brothers, third generation owners of the business, decided a blue-tinged Douglas fir would delight national judges. Although the competing

tree must be under 8 feet tall, the Blue Room designated champion is required to reach a height of nearly 19 feet.

The Bustards harvested the 7-foot-11-inch fir and placed it in a large customized box specifically built for the long trip. They packed their precious cargo in 300 pounds of ice and gently covered it with blankets. Upon arrival, they met with other growers from 14 states at Richardson's Farm for a three-day event.

A panel of six judges chose the final candidates and Bustard's Douglas Fir made the cut. Next, close to 200 tree growers attended the annual meeting to cast their votes. The final step was to assemble a group of 10 people from town to evaluate each finalist. Their task was to choose the tree they would prefer to display in their homes. After all votes were tallied, Bustard's tree was declared Grand National Champion and bestowed the honor of supplying the official White House tree.

"Within 10 minutes, my brother had an announcement on Facebook," exclaims Jay. "Then he called our mom with the wonderful news. rallied to applaud Bustard's. The club an avid supporter of Bustard's annual Trees for Troops weekend.

She's 88 and has seen the business thrive for many years, but this has to be the greatest accomplishment in our history. She immediately thought of our late father and said he would be so proud of us. It truly was an incredible day."

On September 30th, the White House chief usher met with the Bustards at their Lehighton farm site to select the Blue Room Christmas Tree. Officials from NCTGA and PCTGA gathered for the prestigious event. Among others who attended to celebrate Bustard's triumph were Fred Strathmeyer, Jr, deputy secretary of the Pennsylvania Department of Agriculture, Mark McCurdy, member of PTGA's Board of Directors, and Matthew Bradford. PA state representative from Montgomery County's 70th district. In addition, two longtime customers and several members of the Montgomery County Community College Student Nurse Club rallied to applaud Bustard's. The club is Trees for Troops weekend.

Drelick Family's Light Display Featured on ABC



Towamencin' s Drelick Family were contestants on ABC's The Great Christmas Light Fight. The Drelick's Christmas Light Display is over 33 years old. It spans across 8000 square feet, takes approximately eight weeks to assemble, consists of 35,000 lights, has a 25 x 18 foot handmade castle, a 8 x 16 foot handmade church, a clock tower that stands 19 feet in the air, 26 inter active push button stations, and a sign-in book that you can tell us where you are from. Joe, 45, started this tradition at his parents' house in Ambler when he was 13. He now does this at his Towamencin home with his wife Tracey, and his two children, daughter Jordynn, 18, and son Jake, 15 who each have their own hand made pieces in the display which Joe made when they were born.

After interviewing last January they finally got the phone call the first week of August that they made the show! Being on The Great Christmas Light Fight was amazing. The crew flew out from California and filmed for 4 days, 1 day in September, and 3 days in October. The entire display had to set up by October 12. They had 350 family members, neighbors and friends out to support us the night they taped our episode (Oct. 12). It was incredible! The show aired Dec. 7 on ABC. Every night following the broadcast, you could barely make it down Liberty Bell Drive! Everyone wanted to see their display! They were overwhelmed by the support from our community. Although they didn't win, they wouldn't trade the experience for the world. Seeing the joy we put into people's lives during the holiday season makes them winners.

Homestead Exemption Act

The Taxpayer Relief Act provides for property tax reduction through a "homestead exemption." Generally, most owner occupied homes are eligible for the property tax reduction.

In 2000, the County implemented the Homestead Exemption Program to give a tax break to certain property owners. In order to participate, the property must be the primary residence of the property owner. Commercial properties and rental properties do not qualify.

The Township annually, as a part of its budget process, determines the amount of exemption, currently it is \$45,000. Participating homeowners will receive an exemption on the Township portion of their tax bill. For 2016, it is a \$171 tax reduction. When reviewing your tax bill, you will note a County assessed value and a Township assessed value. If the homeowner is participating, the difference in

The homeowner will receive notification from the County only if the property does not qualify for participation. Once a property is participating, it will remain in the program unless its status changes (i.e. sold or rented). A new buyer must register with the County in order to participate.

Storm Preparation

Are You Ready?

Over the last couple of years, the residents of Towamencin Township have experienced Hurricane Sandy, the snow storms of the 2013 - 2014 Winter, and flooding during some very heavy downpours in the local area.

It appears there will be no let-up for the very near-future. Do you have an Emergency Readiness Plan for you and your family? If you needed to evacuate your home during an emergency, have you identified to your family members a place where you will reunite?

Do you have your medications available to be taken with you? Have you considered your pets? Do you have a list of doctors and medications you take?

Should there be a problem with the water supply, do you have the recommended three days of water supply for essentials such as cooking, medicine, and normal hydration? If there is a loss of power do you have batteries for flashlights and lanterns? If you have an emergency generator, is it far enough away from the house to ensure no carbon dioxide gets into your house? To prepare yourself in the event one of the above incidents should happen, you can pickup an Emergency Readiness Plan for Families at the Towamencin Township Building. 2016 Hazardous Waste Collection Events

DATES: COLLECTION INFORMATION: Do Not Bring electronics, appliances, asbes-

Free residential collection events are held outdoors from 9a.m.-3p.m., rain or shine. Residents may attend any Household Hazardous Waste event held by Bucks, Chester, Delaware, Montgomery or Philadelphia Counties. There are no permanent drop off locations. Event workers will unload your materials so please **remain in your vehicle**. Toxic and flammable household chemicals are collected for proper disposal.

Acceptable items include gasoline, oil, kerosene, turpentine, paint thinner, oil paint, stains, varnish, pool chemicals, herbicides, pesticides, antifreeze, caustic cleaners and solvents, mercury thermometers, flares, fire extinguishers, lead acid batteries, rechargeable batteries, fluorescent tube light bulbs, CFL bulbs, mini propane canisters, and electric oil filled heaters.

Containers returned upon request. The maximum amount accepted is 25 gallons or 220 pounds. No 25- or 50-gallon drums. **Do Not Bring** electronics, appliances, asbestos, explosives, ammunition, medical waste, radioactive waste, smoke detectors, items containing Freon, tires or the following:

-Latex or Water-Based Paint is not hazardous and can be placed in the trash once it is dry. Air dry latex paint or add absorbent material like kitty litter until paint becomes a solid.

-Alkaline Household Batteries are not hazardous and should be thrown in the trash.

-Prescription Medications should be disposed of in the secure drop boxes located in many area police stations, a list of which can be found in the Recycling Guide at www.MontgomeryCountyRecycles.org. See page 16 for Towamencin drop off.

-**Propane Tanks** should be taken to locations listed in the Recycling Guide at MontgomeryCountyRecycles.org. Mini-propane canisters are accepted at collections.

DO YOU HAVE AN ALARM?

If so do you know you need to register your alarm with the Police Department? Pursuant to **Section 44-12 Registration of Installation**: every person, corporation, institution or company who has keyed an automatic protection device in the Township of Towamencin to the designated trunk line shall furnish to the Chief of Police a registration of such installation.

PENNSYLVANIA PROPERTY TAX/RENT REBATE PROGRAM

This state-run program benefits eligible Pennsylvanians age 65 and older, widows and widowers age 50 and older, and certain people with disabilities age 18 and older. The annual income limits are \$35,000 for homeowners and \$15,000 for renters (half of Social Security income is excluded).

The Rebate Program is based on property taxes or rent paid the previous calendar year. You may be able to receive a rebate of up to \$650 based on your income bracket.

For more information or to request an application, call 1-888-222-9190. You can also visit them online at <u>www.revenue.state.pa.us</u>. Click on Forms and Publications, then click on Forms for Individuals, then click on Property Tax/Rent Rebate Forms, and finally click on REV-573 Brochure. Print out the application, follow the directions, and mail it in.

Your application must be postmarked by June 30, 2016. You will be required to submit proof of payment along with your application, so please be sure to send a self-addressed stamped envelope when you pay your Township, County, and School taxes by mail so that we can return your receipt stamped and dated. Or, if you pay in person, please bring both parts of your tax bill. A cancelled check also is accepted as proof of payment when accompanied by a copy of your tax bill. If you use a tax accountant or preparation service, they should be able to help you with the rebate application.

Welcome to ReadyMontco

ReadyMontco (formerly known as ReadyNotify) is your official source for notifications about emergencies, severe weather, crime alerts and disasters in Montgomery County, Pennsylvania.

How It Works

When there is a potential safety hazard or concern in your area, you will receive a notification. Notifications come in many forms, including text messages, emails, voice calls, and mobile app alerts. The devices we will contact you on and the order in which we will do so is completely customizable. You might want a text message first, and then a follow up email. Alternatively, you might prefer an email first, with a voice call if you don't respond. You have to enter at least two contact paths, and can provide up to 11.

There may be situations in which public safety personnel will need to know if you have received a message. ReadyMontco enables us to do so. If you confirm that you have received the alert, you will not be contacted by any subsequent methods regarding that particular notification. If you do not confirm, the system will continue to attempt to reach you at all of the contact paths that you have registered. ReadyMontco only sends alerts specific to Montgomery County. Therefore, the address you provide must be located within Montgomery County. If you believe that your address of interest is located within Montgomery County and still have difficulty with registration, please send an email to <u>everbridgesupport@montcopa.org.</u>

The registration process also contains a My Information Tab. If you, a family member, or someone you live with has an Access or Functional Need and will need assistance during an emergency, it is especially important to sign up. It is up to each municipality to determine how they wish to utilize this information, and while it is not a promise of specialized service, it is our goal to use the information you provide to plan for disasters and other emergencies.

It is important that Towamencin Township First Responders are aware of your needs when responding to an emergency at your residence. Towamencin Township Emergency Management will only use the information to ensure you are safely assisted should there be a need for you to evacuate your residence due to natural or man-made emergency. All personal information that you provide will be held securely, only accessed for the purpose of emergency response and planning, and is strictly confidential.

Message From the Codes Department

Please relocate portable basketball stands away from the public right of way. The placement of portable basketball stands along the curb line creates a safety hazard for pedestrians and motor vehicle traffic. In addition, young children should not be encouraged to play basketball in the public roadway. During the fall and winter seasons, portable basketball stands also impede the Public Works Department from clearing leaves and snow from along the curb line. Section 133-34 of the Towamencin Township Code prohibits any objects or obstructions from being placed within the boundaries of the public street or right of way. Therefore, if you have a portable basketball stand or

other object located within the public right of way, please relocate it to your driveway and away from the curb line.

It is the responsibility of all property owners within Towamencin Township to cut all weeds and grass to keep them from growing to a height exceeding 12 inches. Any weeds or lawn areas exceeding 12 inches is considered a nuisance and may result in violation notices and/or citations by the Township. This does not apply to riparian corridor buffers, wetlands, woodlands, floodplains, steep slopes, detention or retention basins, and open space deemed a meadow by the Township.



Emergency Management Tips: Outside Hazards

As we move from winter to spring and summer, thoughts of being out of
the house, outdoor grilling, and working in the yard take the forefront.
Please remember, with the change of seasons also comes the threat of
hurricanes, thunderstorms, and potential flooding.

Be mindful of and remember the following:

<u>Lightning</u>

- -If you can hear thunder, you are within striking distance of light-
- ning. Look for shelter inside a home, large building, or a hard-
- topped vehicle right away.
- -Do not go under trees for shelter. There is no place outside that is safe during a thunderstorm.
- -Stay away from windows and doors. Stay off porches.
- -There is no safe place outside. Places with only a roof on sports
- fields, golf courses, and picnic areas are not safe during a lightning storm. Small sheds should not be used.
- -If a person is struck by lightning, call 9-1-1. Get medical help right away.
 - -Lightning may strike as far as 10 miles from any rain.

Grilling

- -July is the peak month for grill fires.
- -Roughly half of the injuries involving grills are thermal burns.
- -Propane and charcoal BBQ grills should only be used outdoors.
- -The grill should be placed well away from the home, deck railings and out from under eaves and overhanging branches.
- -Keep children and pets at least three feet away from the grill area. -Never leave your grill unattended.
- -Always make sure your gas grill is open before lighting it.
- -If you have a charcoal grill, only use charcoal starter fluid. Never add charcoal fluid or any other flammable liquids to the fire.
- -Keep charcoal fluid out of the reach of children and away from heat sources.
- -If you smell gas while cooking, immediately get away from the grill and call the fire department. Do not move the grill.

at the Bustard Road Station. We assisted several other neighboring fire companies in their fire prevention open house activities as well, demonstrating teamwork in firefighting and rescue skills at each. In November, we had TVFC members and their families

actively working to create and build a float (all in their spare time) for our participation in the Lansdale Mardi Gras Parade to represent Towamencin Township. This family activity allowed the members and their families to participate together in creating the float and to enjoy time together riding in the parade as part of TVFC in a nonemergency environment. We began December with our TVFC Ladies Auxiliary hosting Pictures with Santa Day at our Bustard Road Station. Thanks to you, we had a fantastic turnout for this event. While the great weather sure was a help, your support of our efforts is what made this day a success. It is very

much appreciated. Later in December, the TVFC family once again manned the trucks for our annual Santa Run throughout the township; an event which is looked forward to each year, not only by the residents of Towamencin, but by our members and their families as well. When you add to the above activities, the fire alarms, trainings, meetings and prep work for 2016, you can see your volunteer fire company ended 2015 extremely busy. It was our pleasure serving this community in 2015.



As with any organization, there are many positives to reflect back on from 2015 and some concerns and sadness as well.

On the positive side for TVFC in 2015, we: 1) completed a refresh and upgrade to our company SCBA (Self Contained Breathing Apparatus, or air packs) to stay current with standards and provide the utmost safety to our firefighters, putting the new SCBA

units in service before year end of 2015; 2) placed an order for a new fire truck to replace our oldest pumper which is over 20 years old, with delivery of the new truck expected in mid to late 2016; 3) had recognition on September 30 of TVFC Firefighter Bob Stratton along with Harleysville EMS Paramedic Nicole Smith, who were presented with the National Liberty Museum Award for Valor in Philadelphia for actions taken on May 27, 2014 while on a TVFC rescue incident, both making the initial and most critical "Life Saving" decisions then taking the actions needed that helped this incident remain a "rescue" effort versus a recovery effort, thus saving a life that day. This recognition was a proud moment for Bob but also for the entire TVFC organization and for Towamencin Township.

Our concerns, while minimal but important, for us to reflect on are: 1) for firefighting member Jason Adams, who was deployed to United Arab Emirates for a 6 month tour of duty. We are proud of Jason and his commitment to serve his country as he has this community and look ahead to his safe return some time in 2016; 2) for the increasing challenges which TVFC and surrounding fire companies face in strengthening volunteer membership size to respond to the increased number of alarms in the township and surrounding communities, especially for day time incident response. Additional volunteers are sorely needed by TVFC and all other companies in the area to aid in responsiveness.

Finally, we were saddened over the loss, from illness in late December of two long time TVFC members, Richard (Dick) Foote and Gordon (Gordie) Alderfer. Both Dick and Gordie were 50 plus year life members of TVFC, with Dick still remaining active with the fire police unit. Their service and commitment throughout the years helped shape TVFC as an organization. We thank their families for their support of them in their many years of service to TVFC.

TVFC is well under way and running in 2016. Our Annual Fund Drive was once again a success in 2015 thanks to the residents and business' of Towamencin. In March we will begin the 2016 fund drive. The Towamencin Baseball program, operating under the umbrella of Towamencin Youth Association (TYA), sponsors baseball programs for young men from ages 5-39 in the spring, summer and fall. 2015 was another successful season for our program, highlighted by District Championships for our 9U and 10U Cal Ripken Teams and a Second Place finish in the Connie Mack State Tournament for our Connie Mack A Team.

Fall Season

In Fall 2015, Towamencin Baseball had over 170 players participating in various Fall baseball leagues, learning new skills, trying out new positions, and refining their skills under game conditions.



Inter-Community Fall League Highlights

Towamencin participates along with Whitpain Recreation Association and Montgomery Township Baseball in an Inter-Community Fall League, which sponsors play in 3 divisions: the A League (ages 6-8) is instructional in nature, with an emphasis on teaching the boys to pitch off of the mound, while the AA (ages 8-10) and AAA Leagues (ages 10 -11) balance instruction with competition. Fall Connie Mack Highlights

B Teams (2) — Coaches Steven Berry and Doug Kile — Both teams (ages 13-14) found themselves competing with much older players with impressive results: Berry's crew finished 7-4, while Kile's team racked up an 8-4 record.

A Team — Coach Joe Drelick — This team finished strong at 7-4, and every game seemed to be hotly contested, making for a memorable season.

Winter Workouts

Winter workouts have gained increasing popularity over the past few years, as facilities have opened to host indoor training. 

Environmental Advisory Committee



The Perkiomen Watershed Conservancy is holding their annual Stream Clean-up on Saturday, April 9th at 9:00 a.m. Towamencin Township is part of the Perkiomen Watershed and the Towamencin Creek is a tributary of the Perkiomen Creek. The Stream Clean-up removes trash, scrap metal, tires and other debris from the streams in the watershed. Last year, 570 volunteers worked at 44 sites to remove 449 bags of trash, 102 tires and 2260 pounds of scrap metal. The Environmental Advisory Committee and Township residents participated in the Stream Clean-up in 2014 and 2015, working along the Towamencin Creek in Fischer's Park. Due to the great improve-

ment we saw from 2014 to 2015, the EAC is debating whether the site needs to be cleaned this year. Regardless of whether Towamencin Creek is included in the Stream Clean-up, we would like to encourage Township residents to participate in the Stream Clean -up. The Perkiomen Watershed Conservancy will open online registration available shortly at www.perkiomenwatershed.org. If you know of a stream location in the Township that should be included in the Stream Clean-up, please notify the Township and we will pass this information along to the Perkiomen Watershed Conservancy.


