Pipe Replacement Scheduled on Bustard Road in Towamencin, Worcester Townships

King of Prussia, PA – The Pennsylvania Department of Transportation (PennDOT) announced today that pipe replacement is scheduled on Bustard Road in Towamencin and Worcester townships, Montgomery County.

Motorists are advised of the following travel restrictions:

 Monday, June 10, through Friday, June 14, from 9:00 AM to 3:00 PM, <u>Bustard Road will</u> <u>be closed between Route 73 (Skippack Pike) and Route 63 (Sumneytown Pike)</u>. During the closure, motorists are directed to use Route 73 (Skippack Pike), Old Forty-Foot Road, and Route 63 (Sumneytown Pike).

Local access will be maintained. Drivers are advised to allow extra time when traveling near the work area because backups and delays will occur. All scheduled activities are weather dependent. ``
